2019 YEAR IN REVIEW

Vital Statistics

In 2019, the Scioto Foundation:

- Received \$1.38M in contributions
- Accepted 17 new funds
- Awarded 417 scholarships to 264 students in the amount of \$478,931
- Had a total return on investments of 18%
- Paid \$1.64M in grants, disbursements and scholarships
- Ended the year, 12/31/2019, with assets of \$43,526,038.

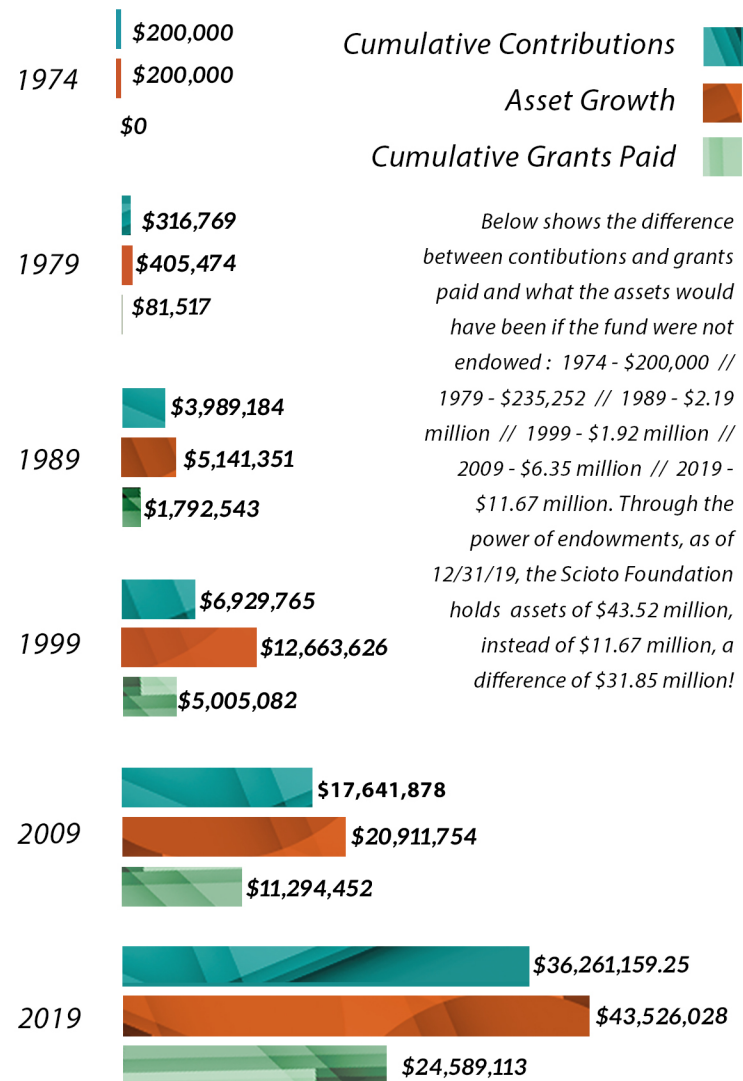
In 2019:

- There were 40 participating nonprofit organizations (5 new) that raised \$119,376
- The Scioto Foundation matching contribution was \$45,000
- A total of \$164,376 was raised during the 12 hour period

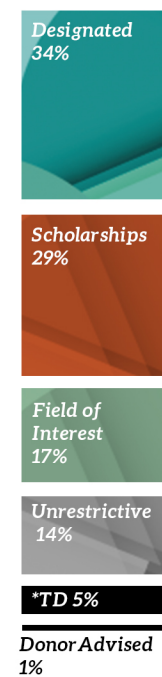
Growth since inception, 1974

Fund types include: **Unrestricted Funds** provide monies for grants and new programs, **Field of interest Funds** provide grant dollars in certain areas, such as health, education, or the arts, **Designated Funds** benefit one or more organizations, **Organizational endowments** are designated funds created by nonprofits for their own use, **Scholarships Funds** range from high school to graduate work, **Donor Advised Funds** are designed for donors that have differing interests. Grants can be made at the suggestion of the donor.

Scioto 365 Dynamic Grantmaking

Scioto 365, is a program where donors actively participate in community grant-making. For \$365 or a dollar a day, donors can create grant categories or themes and then vote on the grant application that best fits that theme.

In 2019:

- The Scioto Foundation raised \$27,875. Fifty percent or \$13,937.50 was available for grants and the other 50% was placed into an endowment fund for future years.
- The membership selected grants in the amount of \$10,390 for the following organizations:



- o South Central Ohio Educational Service Center, "Together Everyone Achieves More Through Collaboration", \$5,000
- o Cirque d'Art Theatre, "How Could You Leave Us?", \$4,090
- o Simon Kenton Council, BSA "Vocational Focused Merit Badge", \$1,300

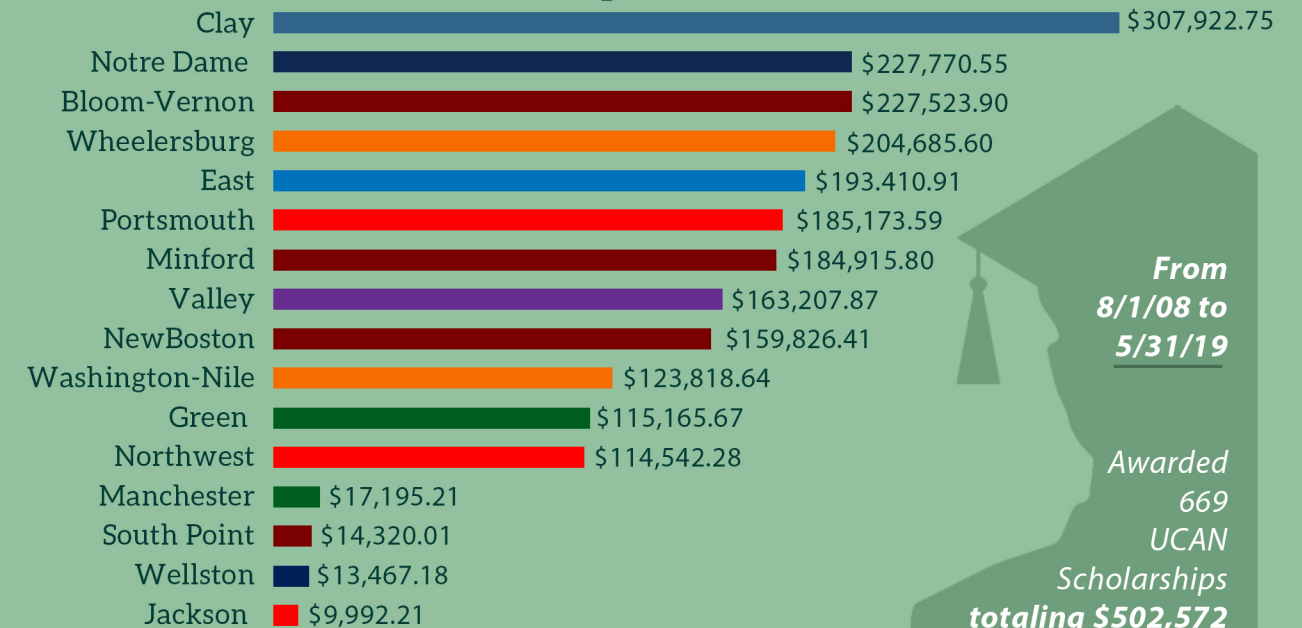
UCAN University/College Access Network

UCAN is the University College Access Network Program. Its goal is to help local high school students to plan, prepare and pay for college. *At the close of 2019, all twelve districts in Scioto Co. and 5 UCAN neighbors (Manchester, Wellston, Jackson, South Point and Symmes Valley) were participating.*

In 2019:

- The Scioto Foundation awarded teacher tuition stipends for 5 UCAN/UCAN Neighbor teachers who participated in the Advanced Placement Summer Institute at Ohio University-Chillicothe to become certified to teach Advanced Placement Courses
- 334 students from UCAN and UCAN Neighbor schools took 405 Advanced Placement Classes
- The UCAN Counselor visited 11 separate school districts and gave college or career advice to 427 students
- The Scioto Foundation awarded 14 UCAN mini-grants in the amount of \$24,698 to help offset the cost of student AP exams, college visits, and ACT Test Prep
- The Scioto Foundation sponsored the Scioto County College Night on October 24, 2019 at the SOMC Friends Center. Over 40 college, university, career tech, and military representatives were on hand to meet with 167 students and their parents.
- UCAN Schools raised \$56,082 for their school scholarship funds. The Scioto Foundation matched another \$25,000 for a total raised of \$81,083.
- Awarded 10 internship grants to local nonprofit and public sector hosts for local college students to work and learn the importance of the nonprofit and public sectors in Scioto County, Ohio.
